

English Course Information

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Pathways: UPC English courses can be packaged for entry to Australian universities and colleges.

Term Dates (Commencement). 2017: 30 Jan, 24 April, 17 July & 9 Oct. 2018: 5 Feb, 30 April, 23 July & 15 Oct.

Intake Dates: Students are admitted every Monday of the first 6 weeks of each term.

Timetables: At least 20 contact hours per week is mandatory. There are 10 weeks per term and 4 terms per year.

Assessment is ongoing. This provides a continual snapshots of where students are read moderately difficult texts read for relaxation and enterta throughout the course. Through this regular \blacklozenge write paragraphs which cohere formal and informal assessment, teachers target students' specific problem areas, adapt instruction, and intervene earlier rather than later.

Study Materials: \$25 per term (10 weeks)

Preparation for IELTS

This course focuses on the IELTS test. At this level the English focus is on reading and listening comprehension, writing and speaking at a tertiary level of study. You will learn to:

- contribute with ease to classroom interaction and discussions of an academic nature
- write notes, assignments, essays and rephrase and rework research findings
- read and understand academic texts and interpret examination questions
- make effective classroom presentations and involve colleagues in discussions.

English for Higher Education

There are 5 levels:

- Level 1: Elementary
- read short texts and develop vocabulary write simple paragraphs
- ♦ interact with others: listen, ask
- questions and communicate personal information and everyday needs

Level 2: Pre-Intermediate

- give & receive instructions, ask for clarification
- read for relaxation and entertainment
- ♦ deal with different genres
- read, understand and extract information from short texts
- understand Australian systems & culture

Level 3: Intermediate

- deal with more complex communication for problem solving in everyday life
- listen to and comprehend a range of complex situations
- write paragraphs dealing with factual material and expressing opinions
- read, understand and interpret longer texts

Level 4: Upper Intermediate (See English for Academic Purposes Level 1- Next Column)

Level 5: Advanced (See English for Academic Purposes Level 2 - Next Column)

English for Academic Purposes

This course (EAP) deals with English language skills necessary for pursuing college or university studies in Australia. This course focuses on skills required in academic study such as:

- communicating information on the everyday and dealing with some abstract academic topics
- reading and understanding texts of a more academic nature & dealing with some abstraction
- making brief classroom presentations
- writing short essays and discussion texts

There are two levels: EAP 1 (Upper Intermediate) and EAP 2 (Advanced)

English for Business EB

This course focuses on the English required at an advanced level of academic study and includes the English used in more specific areas of future study in Business.

In addition, students practise English usage in subjects that underpin and equip them for studying at university level. The four core subjects are: Economics, Business Studies, Mathematics and Information Technology.

English for Higher Education CRICOS 07689B (Max 50 weeks, 15 months)

This is a basic starting point that teaches everyday English and then English for Academic purpose preparing students for higher education studies

Progress is made as each level is successfully completed. However, levels may be repeated if sufficient progress is not made.

Each student works at their own speed and moves forward when the assessments are satisfactory.

Some students will move very quickly through the course which emphasis on all four skills:

- reading
- writing
- speaking and
- listening.

- Pre-intermediate
- Intermediate
- Upper Intermediate and
- Advanced



Preparation for IELTS

CRICOS 076372K (Max 20 weeks, 6 months)

This course focuses on preparation for the International English Language Testing System (IELTS).

As a guide, you need an IELTS score of 5.5 to study for a VET program and from 6.0 to 6.5 (Academic) for entry to a university degree program. For post-study training or immigration purposes, IELTS scores of 6.0 (all skills) are required.

We offer individual intensive IELTS preparation at UPC to meet external IELTS examination dates and entry cut offs for colleges and universities.



English for Academic Purposes CRICOS 076368F (Max 20 weeks, 6 months)

This is a preparation course for further study. We expect that most UPC students will complete at least 10 weeks of the English for Academic Purposes (EAP) course.

Whilst you may be academically excellent in your subject area, you will need to learn how to read, write, listen and speak in an Australian college or university environment and for everyday use while you are in Australia.

Many overseas students find that lectures, tutorials, homework, essay writing and exams are conducted in a different way from their home country.

The EAP course will increase your vocabulary and teach research and writing skills for further academic study.

4 English for Business EB CRICOS 076371M (Up to 20 weeks, 6 months)

The course prepares students for tertiary study through specific English teaching in academic reading, writing, speaking and listening at an advanced level.

Plus, the course provides additional contents within the subject areas that interest you: business, economics, computers and maths.

This course, plus the English for Academic Purposes course, are part of our English for Higher Education Program designed to flow into Australian universities without a formal international English test e.g. IELTS, TOEFL, etc.

Articulation

Dependent on your effort and capability, you will be placed in an appropriate class and progressively move to higher levels.

Internally, there are 6 English proficiency levels and on average, it takes 10 study weeks to complete each level: Beginner, Elementary, Pre-Intermediate, Intermediate, Upper Intermediate and Advanced.

Externally, UPC English courses can be packaged for entry to a number of Australian colleges, higher education institutes and universities^{*}.

Your English Placement Test

All English students are tested before they can be placed in the correct class.

You will be required to take reading, writing and listening tests and have a one-to-one interview with a teacher to see how well you can speak.

Once your test results have been calculated, you will be allocated to an English class to begin your course.

Some of you may have already taken the test administered by UPC representatives. However, you will be re-tested before your class placement.
