# **English Studies**

### English for Higher Education

### CRICOS 076089B AUD 2,500 per term

This is a basic starting point that teaches everyday English and then English for Academic purposes, preparing students for higher education studies.

There are 5 levels of English for Higher Education:

- Level 1: Elementary
- Level 2: Pre-Intermediate
- Level 3: Intermediate
- Level 4: Upper Intermediate
- Level 5: Advanced



### **English for Academic Purposes** CRICOS 076368F AUD 2,500 per term

### **Preparation for IELTS**

### CRICOS 076372K AUD 2,500 per term

This course focuses on preparation for the International English Language Testing System (IELTS). We offer intensive IELTS preparation at UPC to meet external IELTS examination dates and entry cut offs for colleges and universities.

Preparation for IELTS focuses on the IELTS test. At this level the English focus is on reading and listening comprehension, writing and speaking at a tertiary level of study. You will learn to:

- contribute with ease to classroom interaction and discussions of an academic nature
- write notes, assignments, essays and rephrase and rework research findings
- read and understand academic texts and interpret examination questions
- make effective classroom presentations and involve colleagues in discussions



This is a preparation course for further study. We expect that most UPC students will complete at least 10 weeks of the English for Academic Purposes (EAP) course.

Whilst you may be academically excellent in your subject area, you will need to learn how to read, write, listen and speak in an Australian college or university environment and for everyday use while you are in Australia.

Many overseas students find that lectures, tutorials, homework, essay writing and exams are conducted in a different way from their home country.

The course will increase your vocabulary and teach research and writing skills for further academic study. English for Academic Purposes deals with English language skills necessary for pursuing college or university studies in Australia.

This course focuses on skills required in academic study such as:

- communicating information on the everyday and dealing with some abstract academic topics
- reading and understanding texts of a more academic nature & dealing with some abstraction
- making brief classroom presentations
- writing short essays and discussion texts

There are two levels: EAP 1 (Upper Intermediate) and EAP 2 (Advanced)

### **Duration**

It takes 10 study weeks (3 calendar months) to complete each level.

### **Volume of Learning**

English courses are classroom based. You will have to attend 20 hours per week with a minimum attendance rate of 80%. On top of these 20 hours, you need to study in your own time to complete homework and assignments.

# **Childcare Studies**

### CHC30113 Certificate III in Early Childhood Education and Care

### **CRICOS 083064G**

Normal course (12 months - \$8,000) and Fast track course\* (9 months - \$7,000)

This qualification provides students intending to work with children in a supervised or unsupervised capacity. It equips them with the understanding of child-centred approaches, knowledge about learning and development, and how to utilize organization policies and procedures and individual children profiles to plan activities and provide care to children so as to facilitate their leisure and play, and enable them to achieve their physical and mental development.

Undertaking this qualification will prepare you for work in early childhood education settings that meet the requirements of Australia Education and Care Services National Regulations and the National Quality Standard.

The course comprises of 15 core and 3 elective units of competency.

### Volume of Learning

We offer a blended timetable. For the first 7 weeks of each term, you attend classes 14 hours per week and complete another 6 hours of structured self-study doing required coursework. For fast track option\*, you will do a number of units online. We monitor your progress. On top of these, you study in your own time up to 20 hours per week then complete assessments.

### Duration

#### **Normal Option:**

Your study time is 4 terms – Each term, for the first 7 weeks, you will study 20 hours (Classroom and structured self-study). For the last 2 weeks, you will be placed in a childcare centre, 2 days a week (total 120 hours for the course).

#### Fast Track Option\*:

Your study time is 3 terms – Each term, for the first 7 weeks, you will study 20 hours (classroom and structured self-study and up to 5 hours per week online). For the following 3 weeks, you will be placed in a childcare centre, 5 days a week (total 120 hours for the course).

# **Childcare Studies**

### CHC50113 Diploma of Early Childhood Education and Care

### CRICOS 083065G

Diploma Units only (18 months - \$13,200) (You already have Cert III) Direct Diploma (27 months - \$19,200) (You will be awarded the Diploma only) Double qualifications: (You will be awarded both Cert III and Diploma) Normal course (30 months - \$21,200) and Fast track course\* (27 months - \$20,200)

This qualification will teach you the skills required to be responsible for designing and implementing curriculum that foster children's learning and development. In doing so you will work to implement an approved learning framework within the requirements of Australia Education and Care Services National Regulations and the National Quality Standard.

On successful completion, you may also be responsible for supervision of volunteers or other staff. During the course, you'll learn about providing care for children. The course covers a range of units including: developing cultural competencies; ensuring the health and safety of children; using appropriate learning framework to guide practice; analyzing information to inform learning and more.

### Volume of Learning

We offer blended timetables including face-to-face (classroom), structured self-study, online (Options 4) and work placement. On top of these, you study in your own time up to 20 hours per week then complete assessments and workplace logbook.

### Duration

There are 4 options you can choose which depends on your situation.

**Option 1** (You already have CHC30113 Certificate III in ECEC): The course comprises of 23 core (11 are transferred from your Certificate III) and 5 elective units of competency. Weekly load includes 14 hours of classroom plus 6 hours at workplace for 54 study weeks (324 hours in 18 months).

**Option 2** (You want to by-pass Certificate III, enter directly into the Diploma):

The Diploma course comprises of 23 core and 5 elective units of competency. There are two stages.

- Stage 1 (Studying 11 Cert III core units): There are 3 terms (6 months) – Each term, for the first 7 weeks, you will study 14 hours of face-to-face and 6 hours of structured self-study. For the last 2 weeks, you will be placed in a childcare centre, 2 days a week.
- Stage 2: The same as in Option 1.

**Option 3** (You want to obtain both Certificate III and the Diploma at normal speed): There are two stages.

- Stage 1: 4 terms (12 months) Each term, for the first 7 weeks, you will study 20 hours (classroom and structured self-study). For the last 2 weeks, you will be placed in a childcare centre, 2 days a week (total 120 hours for the course).
- Stage 2: The same as in Option 1.

**Option 4**\*(You want to obtain both Certificate III and the Diploma quickly): There are two stages.

- Stage 1: 3 terms (9 months) Each term, for the first 7 weeks, you will study 20 hours (Classroom, structured self-study and up to 5 hours per week online). For the following 3 weeks, you will be placed in a childcare centre, 2 days a week (total 120 hours for the course).
- Stage 2: The same as in Option 1.

### **BSB40215 Certificate IV in Business**

### **CRICOS 087792K**

Normal course (9 months - \$6,000) and Fast track course\* (6 months - \$5,000)

The Certificate IV in Business will help you understand the fundamentals of business to support you in exploring career options or starting your career in business. You will be trained in areas such as creating documents, making presentations, organizing meetings, establishing networks & effective workplace relationships, as well as understanding how to promote products and services.

The course comprises of 1 core and 9 elective units of competency.

### Volume of Learning

We offer blended timetables including face-to-face (Classroom), structured self-study and online (Fast track option). On top of these, you study in your own time up to 20 hours per week then complete assessments, reports, etc.

### Duration

**Normal Option:** Your study time is 3 terms – You will study 14 hours in class and 6 hours of structured self-study. Your trainer will monitor your progress.

**Fast Track Option\*:** Your course duration is 2 terms of 10-week each. You will study 14 hours in class, 6 hours of structured self-study and up to 5 hours eLearning. Your trainer will monitor your progress.

Normal course (12 months - \$8,000) and Fast track course\* (9 months - \$7,000)

The Advanced Diploma prepares students to work in roles with senior or managerial responsibilities. They may oversee the work of others or provide strategic leadership. This qualification is suitable for students who are interested in gaining employment in a high level management role or who wish to pursue university level studies in the management field. Covering critical skills required by all enterprises, the Advanced Diploma covers leadership theories, employee relations, innovation, risk management, diversity, change management, planning and managing finances. These knowledge areas are needed by managers in contemporary Australian and global companies. The course comprises of 4 core units of competency and 8 electives.

### **Articulation to Higher Education**

The Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF) allows students to move from one study level to another (Except in a number of specialist fields). Nowadays, Australian high school graduates are encouraged to start their tertiary study with a VET course.

- Within the VET sector Accredited courses are recognised by all Australian Recognised Training Organisations (RTOs). Students can freely move from one college to another to continue their studies.
- Between VET and higher education (HE) sector The HE sector (Universities and HE providers) gives credits to diploma and advanced diploma graduates who enter their bachelor degree courses, from nine to eighteen months. Credits are dependent on courses and VET providers.
- UPC articulati In general, UPC diploma and advanced diploma graduates will get between 9 to 18-month credits to a number of bachelor courses at a number of HE institutes and universities. For the current articulation list, please see our website.

### **General Notes**

- Term There are 4 terms per year with holiday breaks between terms.
- Term durations Depending on types of course: Ten (10) weeks for English and fast track courses and nine (9) weeks for all other courses.
- Unit of competency is the smallest unit that can be independently assessed and recognised.
- Qualification: The Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF) provides six levels of qualification for the VET sector: Certificates I, II, III and IV, Diploma and Advanced Diploma. Each qualification comprises a number of units of competency.
- Letter of Offer is the first contractual document between you and the College. A Letter of Offer is issued after your application for a course (or courses) has been processed and approved by the College. An Acceptance Letter is attached with the Letter of Offer.
- Confirmation of Enrolment (COE) is issued after the College receive confirmation that you have accepted the offer (by signing the Acceptance Letter) and paid fees as specified in the Letter of Offer. The COE is required when you submit the application to the Australian Immigration for your study visa.
- Vocational Education and Training (VET) is based on partnerships between the Australian government (Policies, regulations and quality assurance), the industry (Training policies and priorities) and course providers (Deliveries and issuance of qualifications). Whether you are looking to move straight into the workforce, or to take an initial step in your tertiary education, a VET qualification can take you where you want to go.
- Unique Student Identifier (USI) is a unique number for each VET student that creates a secure online record of your recognised training gained in Australia from all training providers you have undertaken your studies with. It will give you access to your training records and transcripts for life. The database is maintained by the Australian government.
